## What is a Promise Zone?

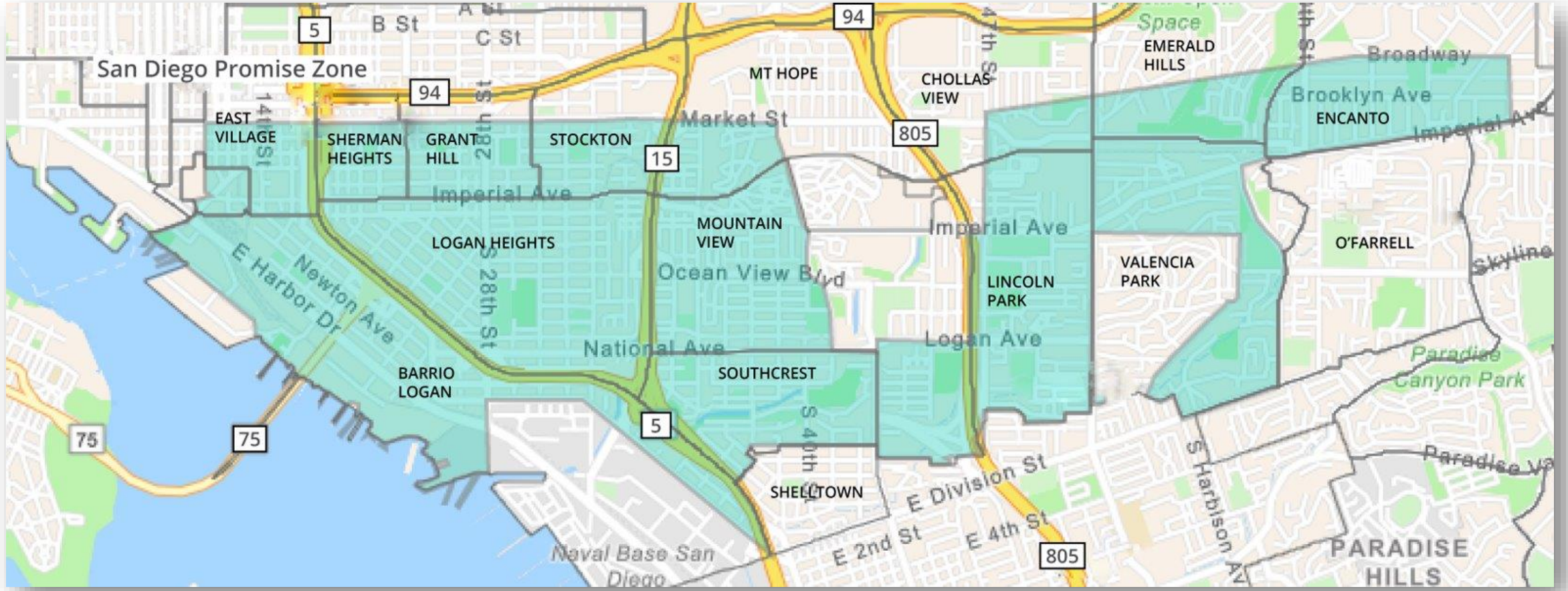
**Goal:** Revitalize 22 nationwide high-poverty communities by infusing federal, state, local, community development and private sector resources into targeted neighborhoods through a collaborative framework.

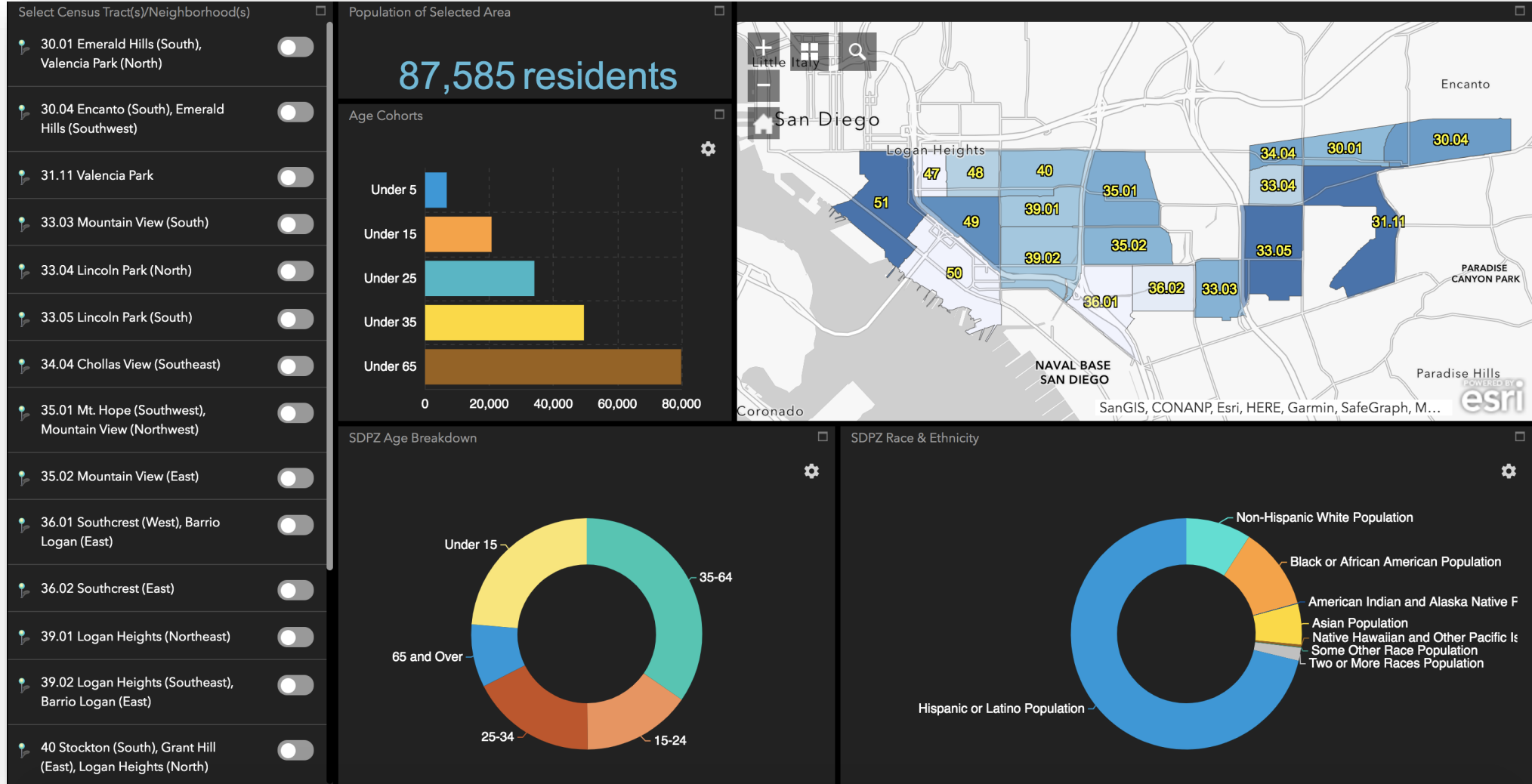
### Eligibility

- One or more census tracts across a **contiguous geography**;
- An overall **poverty** or extremely low-income rate **at or above 33 percent**;
- A **population** of between 10,000 and **200,000 residents**;
- A demonstrated **commitment** of local leadership to the effort.

**A Promise Zone is a designation overseen by a federal agency and does not receive direct federal funding.**



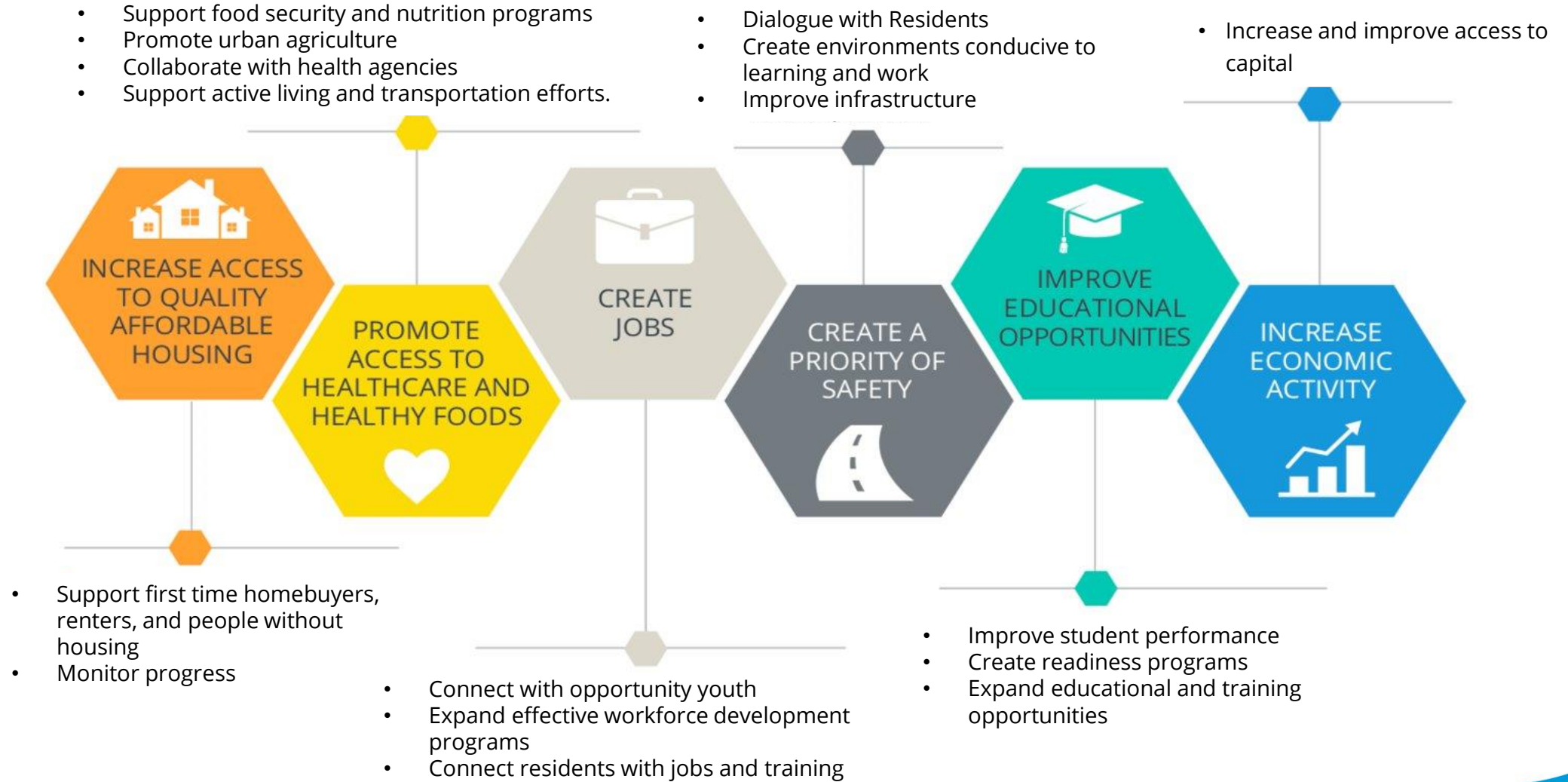

## How does a Promise Zone designation support Partners?

- Convenes organizations to assess and drive shared goals and priorities
- Advocates for coordination and prioritization among government agencies
- Connects partners to pertinent City departments
- Supports, attracts, and creates opportunities for investment
- Provides preference points for certain competitive federal grants and technical assistance
- Connects partners to federal liaison from HUD



## Key Initiative Highlights

- 10-Year Strategic Planning Process
- All 19 Census tracts designated as qualified Opportunity Zones
- Yearly neighborhood business walks
- NASSCO partnership to create pipeline of Opportunity Youth to employment
- First diversity-focused accelerator
- Expedited permitting for affordable housing projects in Promise Zone
- Testing and promotion of “Get It Done App”
- Higher reimbursements and waitlist lifted for small businesses in Promise Zone through Storefront Improvement Program
- Community Perceptions Survey
- Career Pathway Expo
- Priority consideration under City’s Digital Equity Working Group and SD Access 4 All
- Nearly \$50 million in grant funding among Promise Zone partners

## Economic Activity



**Priority:** Increasing and improving access to capital

**Chair:** Logan Heights CDC, Central San Diego Black Chamber of Commerce, Diamond BID

- Created a **Community Navigators Pilot Program** to help small businesses navigate relief efforts through trusted messengers.
- Developed outreach framework of the Small Business and Nonprofit Relief Program.

## Safety



**Priorities:** Dialoguing with Residents; creating environments conducive to learning and work; improving infrastructure

**Interim Chair:** San Diego Unified School District

- Highlighted impactful work from partners
- Discussed ways to collect and leverage data on community perceptions from residents
- Collaborated with Healthy Communities to build a healing garden and develop art mural project proposal

## Healthy Communities

**Priorities:** Supporting food security and nutrition programs; promoting urban agriculture; collaborating with health agencies; supporting active living and transportation efforts

**Chairs:** County of San Diego's Health and Human Services Agency and Urban Corps of San Diego County



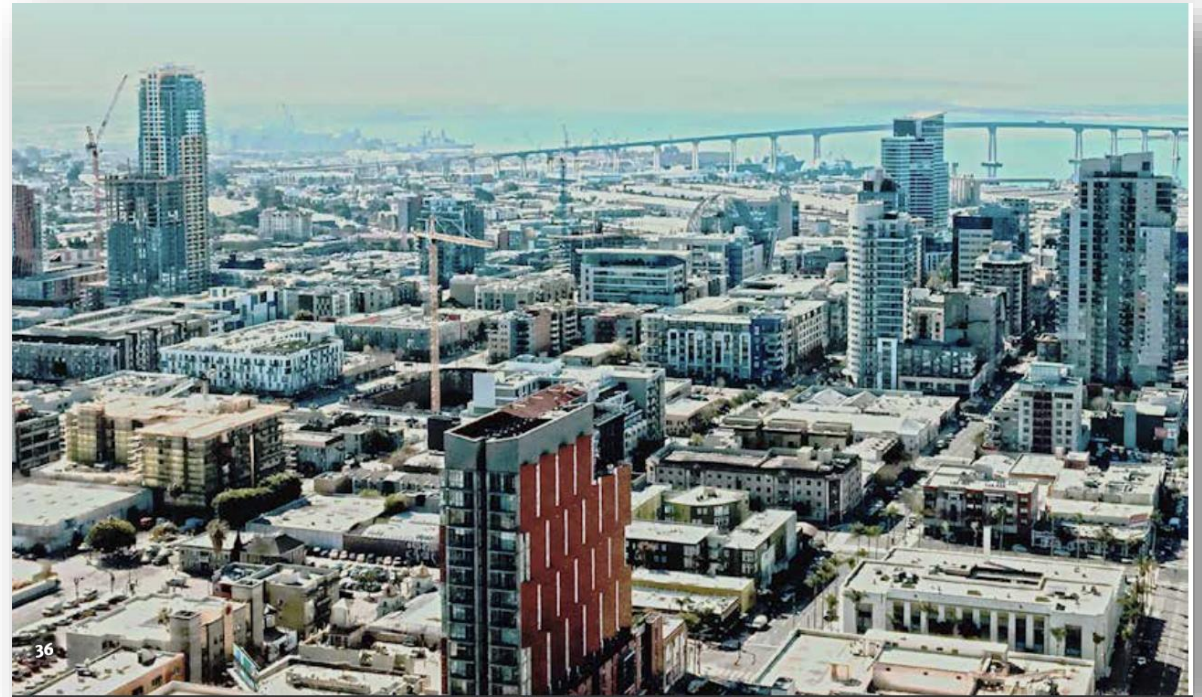
- Working to make community gardens possible in public parks; pursuing funding opportunities to activate vacant lots
- Supporting sustainable transportation and healthy food options

## Housing Affordability

**Priorities:** supporting first-time homebuyers, renters, and people without housing; monitoring progress.

**Chair:** San Diego Housing Commission

- Welcomed new leadership from the San Diego Housing Commission
- Hosted a Homelessness and Housing Affordability Town Hall with panel of experts to discuss current interventions and data tracking methods

## Jobs & Education



**Priorities:** Expand educational and training opportunities; connect with opportunity youth; expand effective workforce development programs

**Chairs:** San Diego Workforce Partnership, the LEAGUE of Amazing Programmers, the City's Economic Development Department, and San Diego Unified School District

- Collectively pursued an Economic Development Administration grant to advance digital equity
- Hosted Digital Inclusion in Promise Zone Workshop Series
- Worked with City Departments in the development of career expo to take place in early 2022

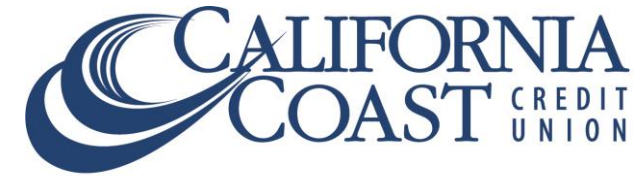

## San Diego Promise Zone Partner Financial Assistance

- Five-year marketing partnership agreement with California Coast Credit Union allocating **\$60,000** annually to Promise Zone initiatives.
- Grant allocations between \$1,500 and \$20,000 will support:
  - Partner Capacity Building
  - Community Outreach Initiatives
  - Programs Addressing Barriers to Post-Secondary Education and Employment
- All work will be carried out by Promise Zone partners.
- Funding will support projects that help advance the goals of the federal designation of the Promise Zone



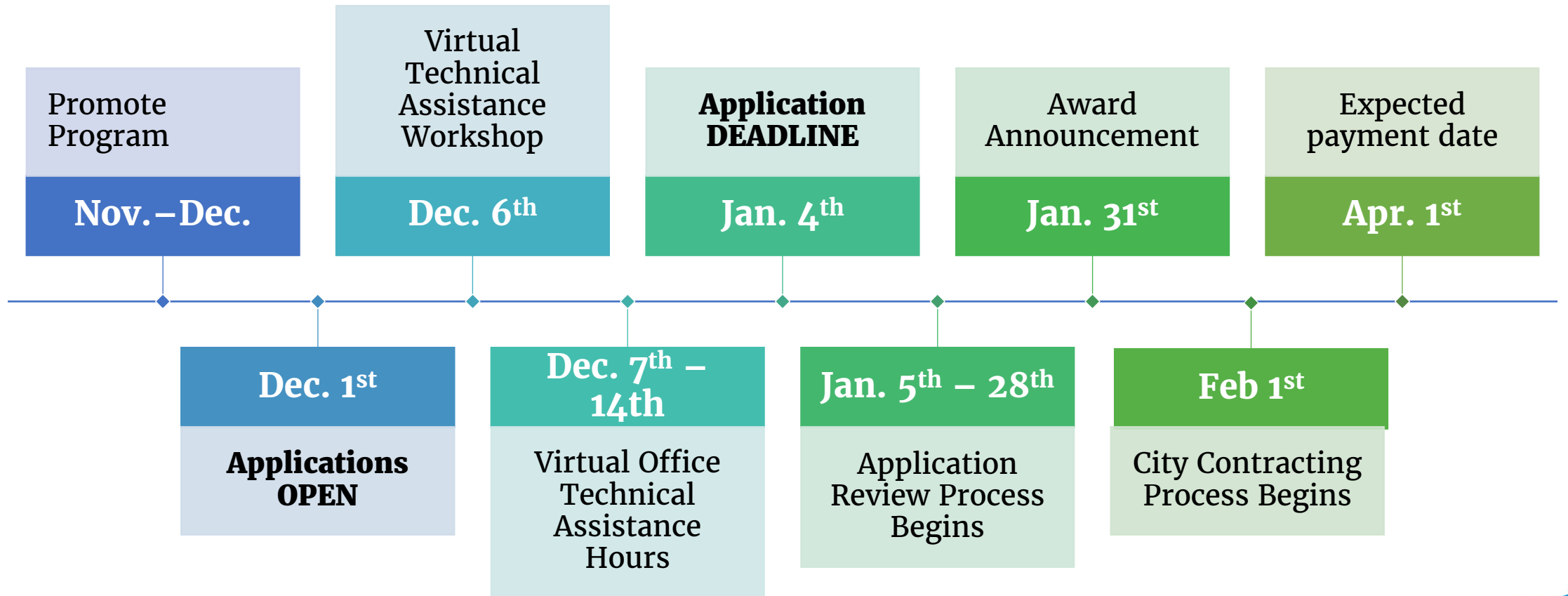

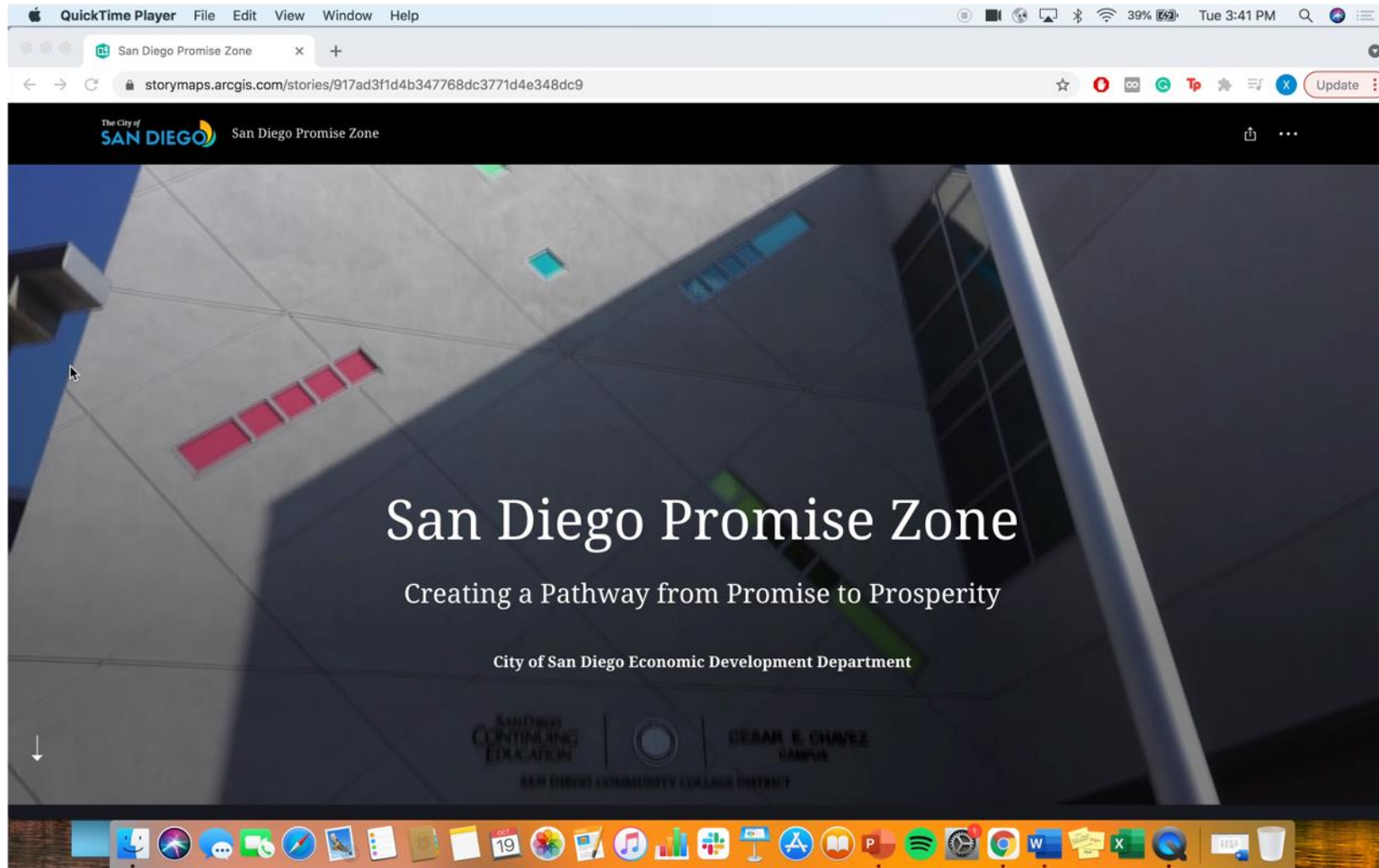
